



Our non-profit organization was born just under five years ago after five likeminded individuals received a double lung transplant. 

Background

The owner of SE 2-59-10-W4 lives on the south side of the correction line and his cattle and machinery are on the north side. There are currently yellow speed signs posted for 60 km/hr around the curve by their residence. He is requesting that the signs be change to white signs with a reduced speed limit so that it can be enforced by the RCMP. They are also requesting that signs be posted to alert drivers that people and farm machinery are frequently crossing the road.

Alternatives

1. Council could continue with the yellow signs - status quo.

2. Council could change the speed signs to white signs as per the request and provide additional signage regarding crossing. This requires passing a bylaw and making an exception of the speed limit for 1/2 mile.

3. Council could put larger yellow 60 km hour signs and add "farm residence ahead" signs. Administration also indicates that mulching trees at the owners residence in the County Right of Way and into the private property would greatly increase the visibility of traveling public around the curve at this location.

Recommendation

That Council approve the installation of larger yellow 60 km hour signs and add "farm residence ahead" signs. Additionally that Administration mulch trees in the County Right of Way and work with the owner to obtain an easement to mulch trees east and west of the property increasing visibility for the traveling public at that location.

We live on the correction line – Township Road 590. Our address is 10103 TWP RD 590.

This is a high traffic road which divides our farm – our residence and machine shop on the south side and cattle and machinery on the north side. It was not our decision to put the road in through our farm. The traffic has been steadily increasing and most travel at an extremely fast speed. There are yellow signs posted of a suggested speed of 60 km/hour for the curve on which we live. Our daughter Lisa, who suffers from cerebral palsy, and myself, who is hard of hearing and slow in walking, cross this road several times a day. We are extremely concerned at this danger, especially that those speeding so fast coming from the west would not be able to stop if needed.

For safety reasons, we respectfully request a change to correct this. We would like to suggest a change to white signs with a reduced speed limit that is enforceable by the RCMP and a crossing sign to alert drivers that people and farm machinery frequently cross there.



As per Section 347(1) (c) of the MGA, council may defer the collection of a tax.

In discussion with Municipal Affairs, tax notices will still need to be mailed to Fort McMurray, however Administration will place a notice on our website for these tax payers that would allow them to contact the County to have a copy of their tax notice emailed to them.

COUNTY OF ST. PAUL NO. 19

BY-LAW NO. 1624

A Bylaw of the County of St. Paul No. 19 in the Province of Alberta, to set penalties for unpaid taxes pursuant to Sections 344 and 345 of the Municipal Government Act SA 2000, Chapter M-26.1 with amendments thereto.

UNDER authority and pursuant to the provisions of Section 344, 345 and 346 of the Municipal Government Act SA 2000, Chapter M-26.1and amendments thereto, the Council of the County of St. Paul No. 19 enacts as follows:

- 1. a) THAT a penalty of three (3%) percent shall be applied to all current taxes remaining unpaid after the 30th day of June in any year, commencing in the year 2013.
 - b) THAT a penalty of ten (10%) percent shall be applied to all current taxes remaining unpaid after the 30th day of November in any year, commencing in the year 2013.
 - b) THAT the said penalties, when applied, shall form part of the current unpaid taxes.
- 2. THAT if, after the thirty-first (31st) day of January in any year, any taxes which became due and payable remain unpaid, there shall be a ten (10%) percent penalty added on the first (1st) day of February, and each subsequent February first (1st) thereafter so long as the taxes remain unpaid, and every amount so added shall form part of the taxes in respect of which it is imposed. This penalty will commence in the year 2014.
- 3. Notwithstanding the provisions of clauses 1 and 2, should dates stated therein (July 1, December 1 and February 1) fall on a non-working day, then the penalties shall be imposed at the end of the first working day after those dates.
- 4. This Bylaw shall come into force and effect on March 2, 2013.
- 5. Bylaw No. 1400 dated March 11, 2003 to be rescinded upon this bylaw coming into force and effect.
