

Call for Expression of Interest to be a Candidate for Participation in Regional Plan Review Panels

The Government of Alberta is continuing its work on developing seven regional plans under the direction of the Land-use Framework for Alberta. Each plan provides the context and guidance for land and natural resource use in each region to help achieve Alberta's long-term social and economic goals based on a foundation of good environmental management.

Regional plans are developed in consultation with Albertans and become legal instruments once approved by Cabinet. As such, the *Alberta Land Stewardship Act (ALSA)* includes provisions for requesting a review of a regional plan or regional plan amendment. To support this review process, the Government of Alberta is creating a standing roster of candidates from which it will select members to participate in review panels for regional plans once the plans have been implemented. The role of the panel will be to consider review requests and provide recommendations to the Government of Alberta.

Candidates from the roster will be invited to participate in panels based on the subject matter of the review and the candidate's area of expertise. Once the roster is established, candidate names will sit on the roster for between two to three years. The roster will consist of a broad range of stakeholders and as such, individuals with a background or interest in property rights, First Nations, business, environment and rural or urban interests are encouraged to apply.
