BALANCING RURAL HERITAGE WITH A DIVERSE ECONOMY

POLICY OBJECTIVE:

The County of St. Paul desires to offer take-it-or-leave-it areas at its Class III Landfills and Waste Transfer Facilities to extend the life of its facilities while ensuring the safety of the public.

POLICY STATEMENT:

- A) GENERAL MATTERS
- No prohibited materials shall be deposited in the Take-It-Or-Leave-It Areas as listed in Section 3.3 of the Evergreen Waste Management Services Commission Operations Plan for the County of St. Paul's Class III Landfills and Waste Transfer Facilities.
- No carpets, linoleum, clothing, shoes, bedding, food items, mattresses, boxsprings, baby walkers, cribs, carseats, refrigerators, freezers, stoves, dishwashers, microwaves, washingmachines, clothes dryers, hot water tanks, humidifiers, de-humidifiers, televisions, any similar appliances, or any type of Personal Protective Equipment including but not limited to helmets, hard hats, safety boots, masks, or life jackets.
- 3) Items must be clean, in reasonably good condition, and may require minor repairs.
- The Site Attendant shall have final discretion regarding which items are acceptable and they may refuse any item for any reason.
- 5) Items that have been left in the Take-It-Or-Leave-It Area for more than thirty (30) days are to be disposed of by any means of recycling or salvaging as a last resort of waste disposal.

- Any material placed in the Municipal Solid Waste bins, inert waste cells, metal site, appliance site, tire marshalling area, or burn pits may not be transferred to the Take-It-Or-Leave-It Area.
- 7) The County cannot guarantee or warranty any items taken from the Take-It-Or-Leave-It Area.
- 8) The County is not liable or responsible for any items taken from the Take-It-Or-Leave-It Area.
- 9) All items obtained from the Take-It-Or-Leave-It Area are the sole responsibility of the person who takes them.
